



# Dear IPAT Members,

Many of you have been asking about our 2026 Convention. We have looked into several locations. Astronomical prices on room rentals, rising costs on catering. You probably see many of the same things in your everyday life, so I am not telling you anything you don't know.

Those of you who came to our last Convention in Grapevine, were impressed with what we did, but commented on how few people there were from prior years. Our vendors were also disappointed with the small turnout, and questioned if it was worth the expense of the trip. At the end of the Convention, IPAT only turned a profit on the Convention thanks to the auction, online competition and a grant the covered most of the teacher's salaries. It is no secret that our membership is falling off, and that we need to change some things. With the rising costs and diminishing returns of a Convention, that is a thing that we are going to change.

For many of you, the best part of the Convention was the Pre-Convention School—getting to learn from a renowned teacher, and getting to make new friends or see old ones. Starting this fall, instead of a Convention, IPAT is going to have IRAP—IPAT Resident Artist Program. Artists from around the world will come to our beautiful Museum to teach. We will use our own kilns and space, so we don't need to worry about that, and you still get the benefit of learning and fellowship. 


